AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO PRESERVE THE TRADITIONAL NEW
MEXICAN AGRICULTURAL WAY OF LIFE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. --Two hundred fifty thousand
dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to
the economic development department for expenditure in fiscal
year 2003 to contract with a nonprofit farmers' market
organization comprised of at least one hundred fifty members,
administratively based in Santa Fe county, for an economic
development plan and its implementation, which will serve as a
catalyst to create agricultural jobs in a regional economy,
preserve the traditional New Mexican agricultural way of life,
provide food for the poor, expand the market for state-grown
agricultural products, create revenue circulation within the

1 state, bridge the gap between urban and rural communities and
2 leverage state funding through federal and private sources.
3 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
