AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; CREATING A NEW OFFENSE KNOWN AS UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF A BIOLOGICAL OR CHEMICAL WEAPON; ENACTING A NEW SECTION OF THE CRIMINAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF A BIOLOGICAL OR CHEMICAL WEAPON. --

- A. Unlawful possession of a biological or chemical weapon consists of a person knowingly possessing a biological or chemical weapon for a non-peaceful purpose in order to cause death or harm to a human, animal or plant.
- B. Whoever commits unlawful possession of a biological or a chemical weapon is guilty of a fourth degree . 140014.1

10	(2) "chemical weapon" means a weapon that

13	"Chemical weapon" does not include:
14	(a) riot-control agents when used by

16	(b) chemical herbicides;
17	(c) smoke and flame materials; or
18	(d) mace, pepper spray or any other
19	analogous commercially produced personal defense device.
20	D. The provisions of this section do not apply to
21	individuals or institutions authorized by the state or federal
22	government to posses biological or chemical weapons."
