11	RELATING TO EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT; EXPANDING THE DEFINITION OF
12	EMERGENCY CONDITION; PROVIDING AN EXEMPTION FOR PLANNING AND

14	NMSA 1978; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. Section 13-1-127 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984,
18	Chapter 65, Section 100, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"13-1-127. EMERGENCY PROCUREMENTS
20	A. The state purchasing agent, a central
21	purchasing office or a designee of either may make or
22	authorize others to make emergency procurements when there
23	exists a threat to public health, welfare, safety or property
24	requiring procurement under emergency conditions; provided
25	that emergency procurements shall be made with competition as
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is practicable under the circumstances. A written
determination of the basis for the emergency procurement and
for the selection of the particular contractor or vendor shall
be included in the procurement file. Emergency procurements
shall not include the purchase or lease purchase of heavy road
equipment.

7 **B**. An emergency condition is a situation which creates a threat to public health, welfare or safety such as 8 9 may arise by reason of floods, <u>fires</u>, epidemics, riots, <u>acts</u> 10 of terrorism, equipment failures or similar events and 11 includes the planning and preparing for an emergency response. 12 The existence of the emergency condition creates an immediate 13 and serious need for services. construction or items of 14 tangible personal property that cannot be met through normal 15 procurement methods and the lack of which would seriously 16 threaten:

(1) the functioning of government;

(2) the preservation or protection of

property; or

(3) the health or safety of any person.
C. Money expended for planning and preparing for
an emergency response shall be accounted for and reported to
the legislative finance committee and the department of
finance and administration within sixty days after the end of
each fiscal year."
