SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 411 appropriates \$200.0 from the general fund to the Board of Regents of the University of New Mexico (UNM) for expenditure in FY2003 to support access to legal research by state inmates incarcerated in New Mexico correctional facilities through the UNM School of Law.

Significant Issues

RELATIONSHIP
