SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Joint Memorial 16 requests the Department of Health, in conjunction with the State Department of Education and middle and high schools throughout the state, develop a mentoring program for students to learn about health care professions.

The memorial requests the program include:

- a recruitment and retention approach ;
- a method to identify students who are interested in health care professions;
- progress of students in such programs be tracked;
- encouragement for students to participate in mathematics and science classes beyond basic requirements; and
