Synopsis of Bill

House Joint Memorial 9 requests the New Mexico Legislature to continue the Legislative Education Study Committee ad hoc committee on education reform.

Significant Issues

The Legislative Education Study Committee participated in the Education Initiatives and Accountability Task Force, established in 1999 by the New Mexico Legislative Council. The purpose of the task force was to review the current status of New Mexico's educational system and to make recommendations to the Legislature to reform the system for improved performance. The legislation would continue the ad hoc committee to continue the focus of the task force.
