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14	WHEREAS, oriental medicine has been practiced throughout
15	the world for over three millennia; and
16	WHEREAS, doctors of oriental medicine have been licensed
17	to practice in New Mexico for over twenty years; and
18	WHEREAS, in many cases New Mexicans have experienced
19	notable benefits from the services provided by doctors of
20	oriental medicine after little or no relief from other
21	therapies, including cases of common childhood illnesses such
22	as chronic ear infections, asthma, recurring coughs and sore
23	throats; and
24	WHEREAS, New Mexico enjoys a great diversity in cultures
25	and lifestyle choices, and New Mexicans have the right to

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access the health care of their choice without discrimination; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department be requested to include doctors of oriental medicine in discussions of medicaid issues during the 2002 interim; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in future proposed legislation regarding medicaid, doctors of oriental medicine be included as providers for their scope of practice pursuant to the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of human services, the director of the medical assistance division of the human services department and to the members of the New Mexico congressional delegation.

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
