NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the director of homeland security as designated by the governor in executive order 2003-001, the department of health, the New Mexico department of agriculture and the New Mexico livestock board be requested to collaborate with the United States departments of homeland security and agriculture and representatives of agricultural organizations within New Mexico to develop defenses against potential biological and chemical attacks on New Mexico's agricultural industry; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the director of homeland security, the secretary of health, the director of the New Mexico department of agriculture and the executive director of the New Mexico livestock board.
