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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 22-13-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1972,
17	Chapter 95, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"22-13-5. SPECIAL EDUCATIONSchool districts shall
19	provide special education and related services appropriate to
20	meet the needs of all children requiring special education and
21	related services. [Regulations] <u>Rules</u> and standards shall be
22	developed and established by the [state board] <u>department</u> for
23	the provision of special education in the schools and classes
24	of the public school system in the state and in all
25	institutions wholly or partly supported by the state <u>except the</u>
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1 <u>New Mexico military institute</u>. The [state board] department shall monitor and enforce the [regulations] rules and 2 3 School districts shall also provide services for standards. 4 three-year-old and four-year-old preschool children with 5 disabilities, unless the parent or guardian chooses not to enroll his child. If a child receiving services in the 6 department of health's family, infant, toddler program has his 7 third birthday during the school year, the child's parents 8 shall have the option of having the child complete the school 9 10 year in the family, infant, toddler program or enrolling the child in the public school's preschool program. A child with a 11 12 disability who enrolls in the public school's preschool program 13 and who has his third birthday during a school year may receive special education and related services from the beginning of 14 that school year. Services for students age three through 15 twenty-one may include, but are not limited to, evaluating 16 particular needs, providing learning experiences that develop 17 cognitive and social skills, arranging for or providing related 18 services as defined by the [state board] department and 19 providing parent education. The services may be provided by 20 [certified school personnel] licensed school employees or 21 contracted for with other community agencies and shall be 22 provided in age-appropriate, integrated settings, including 23 home, daycare centers, head start programs, schools or 24 community-based settings." 25

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
