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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
20	Section 1. Section 10-11-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987,
21	Chapter 253, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
22	"10-11-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Public Employees
23	Retirement Act:
24	A. "accumulated member contributions" means the
25	amounts deducted from the salary of a member and credited to
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the member's individual account, together with interest, if any, credited to that account;

B. "affiliated public employer" means the state and any public employer affiliated with the association as provided in the Public Employees Retirement Act, but does not include an employer pursuant to the Magistrate Retirement Act, the Judicial Retirement Act or the Educational Retirement Act;

8 C. "association" means the public employees
9 retirement association established under the Public Employees
10 Retirement Act;

D. "disability retired member" means a retired member who is receiving a pension pursuant to the disability retirement provisions of the Public Employees Retirement Act;

E. "disability retirement pension" means the pension paid pursuant to the disability retirement provisions of the Public Employees Retirement Act;

F. "educational retirement system" means that retirement system provided for in the Educational Retirement Act;

G. "employee" means any employee of an affiliated public employer;

H. "federal social security program" means that program or those programs created and administered pursuant to the act of congress approved August 14, 1935, Chapter 531, 49 Stat. 620, as that act may be amended;

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I. "final average salary" means the final average salary calculated in accordance with the provisions of the applicable coverage plan;

J. "form of payment" means the applicable form of payment of a pension provided for in Section 10-11-117 NMSA 1978;

K. "former member" means a person who was
 previously employed by an affiliated public employer, who has
 terminated that employment and who has received a refund of
 member contributions;

L. "fund" means the funds included under the Public Employees Retirement Act;

M "member" means a currently employed, contributing employee of an affiliated public employer, or a person who has been but is not currently employed by an affiliated public employer, who has not retired and who has not received a refund of member contributions; "member" also includes the following:

(1) "adult correctional officer member" means
 a member who is an adult correctional officer or an adult
 correctional officer specialist employed by a correctional
 facility of the corrections department or its successor agency;

(2) "hazardous duty member" means a member whois a juvenile correctional officer employed by the children,youth and families department or its successor agency;

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1	(3) "motor transportation and special
2	investigations member" means a member who is employed by the
3	motor transportation division or the special investigations
4	<u>division of the department of public safety;</u>
5	[(3)] <u>(4)</u> "municipal detention officer member"
6	means a member who is employed by an affiliated public employer

8	responsibilities at a facility used for the confinement of
9	persons charged with or convicted of a violation of a law or

11	[(4)] <u>(5)</u> "municipal fire member" means [any]
12	<u>a</u> member who is employed as a full-time nonvolunteer
13	firefighter by an affiliated public employer and who has taken
14	the oath prescribed for firefighters;
15	[(5)] <u>(6)</u> "municipal police member" means
16	[any] <u>a</u> member who is employed as a police officer by an
17	affiliated public employer, other than the state, and who has
18	taken the oath prescribed for police officers; and
19	[(6)] <u>(7)</u> "state police member" means [any] <u>a</u>
20	member who is an officer of the New Mexico state police and who
21	has taken the oath prescribed for such officers;
22	N. "membership" means membership in the
23	association;
24	0. "pension" means a series of monthly payments to
25	a retired member or survivor beneficiary as provided in the
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1 Public Employees Retirement Act;

P. "public employer" means the state, [any] <u>a</u> municipality, city, county, metropolitan arroyo flood control authority, economic development district, regional housing authority, soil and water conservation district, entity created pursuant to a joint powers agreement, council of government, conservancy district, water and sanitation district, water district and metropolitan water board, including the boards, departments, bureaus and agencies of a public employer, so long as these entities fall within the meaning of governmental plan as that term is used in Section 414(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

Q. "refund beneficiary" means a person designated by the member, in writing, in the form prescribed by the association, as the person who would be refunded the member's accumulated member contributions payable if the member dies and no survivor pension is payable or who would receive the difference between pension paid and accumulated member contributions if the retired member dies before receiving in pension payments the amount of the accumulated member contributions;

R. "retire" means to:

(1) terminate employment with all employers covered by any state system or the educational retirement system; and

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(2) receive a pension from a state system orthe educational retirement system;

S. "retired member" means a person who has met all requirements for retirement and who is receiving a pension from the fund;

T. "retirement board" means the retirement board provided for in the Public Employees Retirement Act;

U. "salary" means the base salary or wages paid a member, including longevity pay, for personal services rendered an affiliated public employer. "Salary" shall not include overtime pay, allowances for housing, clothing, equipment or travel, payments for unused sick leave, unless the unused sick leave payment is made through continuation of the member on the regular payroll for the period represented by that payment, and any other form of remuneration not specifically designated by law as included in salary for Public Employees Retirement Act purposes. Salary in excess of the limitations set forth in Section 401(a) (17) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, shall be disregarded. The limitation on compensation for eligible employees shall not be less than the amount that was allowed to be taken into account under the state retirement system acts in effect on July 1, 1993. For purposes of this subsection, "eligible employee" means an individual who was a member of a state system before the first plan year beginning after December 31, 1995;

Section 10. TEMPORARY PROVISION--STATE POLICE MEMBER. 8 ADULT CORRECTIONAL OFFICER MEMBER AND MOTOR TRANSPORTATION AND 9 10 SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS MEMBER COVERAGE PLAN 1--ELECTIONS. -- On or before October 1, 2004, the retirement board shall conduct 11 12 an election to submit to motor transportation and special 13 investigations members currently contributing under state general coverage plan 3 the question of adopting a state police 14 member, adult correctional officer member and motor 15 transportation and special investigations member coverage 16 plan 1. The election shall be conducted in accordance with 17 procedures adopted by the retirement board, and the retirement 18 board shall certify the results of the election to the 19 secretary of state on or before November 1, 2004. 20

Section 11. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2004.

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
