MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY.--24 Α. The following are eligible for medicaid: 25 a participant who is in transition to (1) .149352.1

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1 self-sufficiency due to employment or child support; 2 a pregnant woman who meets the income and (2) resource requirements for New Mexico's aid to families with 3 4 dependent children as they existed on July 16, 1996; (3) a member of a benefit group who is 5 eighteen years of age or younger if the benefit group's income 6 7 is below one hundred eighty-five percent of the federal poverty 8 guidelines; 9 (4) a pregnant woman whose income is below one 10 hundred eighty-five percent of the federal poverty guidelines; (5) participants receiving federal 11 12 supplemental security income; an aged, blind or disabled person in an (6) 13 institution who meets all the supplemental security income 14 standards except for income; 15 (7) a person who meets all standards for 16 institutional care but is cared for at home and meets 17 18 eligibility standards for medicaid; a qualified medicare beneficiary, 19 (8) 20 qualified disabled working person or specified low-income medicare beneficiary; [and] 21 (9) a foster child in the custody of the state 22 or of an Indian pueblo, tribe or nation who meets eligibility 23 standards for medicare; and 24 (10) to the extent that existing benefits and 25 .149352.1 - 2 -
