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## **HOUSE BILL 443**

## AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE; PROVIDING AN INCOME TAX EXEMPTION AND A GROSS RECEIPTS TAX EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN STIPENDS AND AWARDS RECEIVED BY CERTAIN HEALTH PROFESSIONALS; AMENDING THE HEALTH PROFESSIONAL LOAN REPAYMENT ACT TO INCREASE THE SCOPE OF THE ACT: MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Income Tax Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] EXEMPTION--CERTAIN STIPENDS AND AWARDS
RECEIVED BY HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.--Stipends received from the
New Mexico health service corps pursuant to the Health Service
Corps Act and awards received pursuant to the Health
Professional Loan Repayment Act are exempt from taxation."

Section 2. A new section of the Gross Receipts and . 150240.  $\mathbf{1}$ 

Compensating Tax Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] EXEMPTION--GROSS RECEIPTS--CERTAIN
STIPENDS AND AWARDS RECEIVED BY HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.--Exempted
from the gross receipts tax are the receipts of a health
professional received as a stipend pursuant to the Health
Service Corps Act or as an award pursuant to the Health
Professional Loan Repayment Act."

Section 3. Section 21-1-26.8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 144, Section 1) is amended to read:

"21-1-26. 8. HEALTH PROFESSION ADVISORY COMMITTEE--CREATED--DUTIES.--

A. The "health profession advisory committee" is created to advise the commission on higher education on matters relating to the administration of student loan programs for health professionals. The health profession advisory committee replaces the medical shortage area committee.

B. The health profession advisory committee shall be composed of a representative of the department of health; a representative of the New Mexico health policy commission; and representatives of public post-secondary health and medical training programs, underserved health and medical area providers, recruiting and placement organizations and professional health and medical associations. Members shall be appointed by the commission on higher education pursuant to the policies and procedures of the commission.

Section 5. Section 21-22D-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 144, Section 19) is amended to read:

"21-22D-4. COMMISSION POWERS AND DUTIES--PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY--QUALIFICATIONS. --

- A. The commission may grant an award to repay loans obtained for health [educational] education expenses of a health professional upon such terms and conditions as may be imposed by regulations of the commission.
- B. Applicants shall be licensed or certified to practice in New Mexico as health professionals and shall be bona fide citizens and residents of the United States and of New Mexico. Applicants shall declare their intent to practice as health professionals within designated health professional shortage areas or acute shortage areas of the state.
- C. The commission shall make a full and careful investigation of the ability, character and qualifications of each applicant and determine fitness to become a health professional in the health professional loan repayment program.
- D. The commission shall assist selected health professionals in locating practice positions in designated health professional shortage areas or acute shortage areas."

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Section 6. APPROPRIATION. -- Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the health professional loan repayment fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2005 and subsequent fiscal years for the purpose of making awards pursuant to the Health Professional Loan Repayment Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

Section 7. APPLICABILITY. -- The provisions of Section 1 of this 2004 act apply to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2004.

EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the Section 8. provisions of this act is July 1, 2004.

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
