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1 authorized to be imposed by a county or municipality upon the taxpayer's use of property, as the term "use" is defined in the 2 Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act, and required to be 3 4 collected by the department at the same time and in the same manner as the compensating tax; "local option compensating tax" 5 includes the compensating taxes imposed pursuant to the 6 Municipal Local Option Gross Receipts Taxes Act, Supplemental 7 Municipal Gross Receipts Tax Act, County Local Option Gross 8 Receipts Taxes Act, Local Hospital Gross Receipts Tax Act, 9 10 County Correctional Facility Gross Receipts Tax Act and such other acts as may be enacted authorizing counties or 11 12 municipalities to impose taxes on use of property, which taxes are to be collected by the department in the same time and in 13 the same manner as it collects the compensating tax; 14

[J.-] <u>K.</u> "net receipts" means the total amount of money paid by taxpayers to the department in a month pursuant to a tax or tax act less any refunds disbursed in that month with respect to that tax or tax act;

[K.-] <u>L.</u> "overpayment" means an amount paid, pursuant to any law subject to administration and enforcement under the provisions of the Tax Administration Act, by a person to the department or withheld from the person in excess of tax due from the person to the state at the time of the payment or at the time the amount withheld is credited against tax due;

[L.] <u>M</u> "paid" includes the term "paid over";

[M-] N. "pay" includes the term "pay over";

[N.] <u>O.</u> "payment" includes the term "payment over";

[0.] <u>P.</u> "person" means any individual, estate, trust, receiver, cooperative association, club, corporation, .149642.1

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1 company, firm, partnership, limited liability company, limited 2 liability partnership, joint venture, syndicate, other 3 association or gas, water or electric utility owned or operated by a county or municipality; "person" also means, to the extent 4 permitted by law, a federal, state or other governmental unit 5 or subdivision, or an agency, department or instrumentality 6 thereof; and "person", as used in Sections 7-1-72 through 7 7-1-74 NMSA 1978, also includes an officer or employee of a 8 corporation, a member or employee of a partnership or any 9 10 individual who, as such, is under a duty to perform any act in respect of which a violation occurs; 11

[P.] <u>Q.</u> "property" means property or rights to property;

[Q.-] <u>R.</u> "property or rights to property" means any tangible property, real or personal, or any intangible property of a taxpayer;

[R.-] <u>S.</u> "secretary" means the secretary of taxation and revenue and, except for purposes of Subsection B of Section 7-1-4 NMSA 1978 and Subsection E of Section 7-1-24 NMSA 1978, also includes the deputy secretary or a division director or deputy division director delegated by the secretary;

[S.-] <u>T.</u> "secretary or the secretary's delegate" means the secretary or any employee of the department exercising authority lawfully delegated to that employee by the secretary;

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[T.] <u>U.</u> "security" means money, property or rights to property or a surety bond;

"7-1-6.12. TRANSFER--REVENUES FROM MUNICIPAL LOCAL OPTION GROSS RECEIPTS TAXES--<u>REVENUES FROM LOCAL OPTION COMPENSATING</u> <u>TAXES.--</u>

<u>A.</u> A transfer pursuant to Section 7-1-6.1 NMSA 1978 shall be made to each municipality for which the department is collecting a local option gross receipts tax imposed by that municipality in an amount, subject to any increase or decrease made pursuant to Section 7-1-6.15 NMSA 1978, equal to the net

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imposed by that municipality, less any deduction for administrative cost determined and made by the department pursuant to the provisions of the act authorizing imposition by that municipality of the local option gross receipts tax and any additional administrative fee withheld pursuant to Subsection C of Section [1 of this 1997 act] 7-1-6.41 NMSA B. Section 5. A new section of the Tax Administration Act is enacted to read:

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"[NEW MATERIAL] LOCATION OF USE. --1 For compensating tax and local option 2 A. compensating tax purposes, use of property occurs in the 3 4 jurisdiction in which: the buyer's place of business is located 5 (1)if the buyer is engaging in business in New Mexico and uses 6 7 the property in furtherance of that business; the buyer's principal office is located 8 (2)if the buyer is the state or a local government or an agency 9 10 or instrumentality of the state or a local government; or the buyer's residence is located if the 11 (3) 12 buyer is not engaging in business in New Mexico or does not 13 use the property in furtherance of business. The department shall promulgate regulations to 14 **B**. determine where use will be attributed when the buyer has 15 16 more than one business location or residence in New Mexico." Section 8. A new section of the Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CREDIT--COMPENSATING TAX--MUNICIPAL COMPENSATING TAX PAID.--A credit shall be allowed for each reporting period against the compensating tax for an amount of the municipal compensating tax equal to:

A. one-half percent of the value of property for which the taxpayer is liable for that reporting period if the rate of the municipal compensating tax in effect at the time of the use was one-half percent; or

B. one-fourth percent of the value of property for which the taxpayer is liable for that reporting period if the rate of the municipal compensating tax in effect at the time of the use was one-fourth percent."

Section 9. Section 7-19-12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, Chapter 397, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"7-19-12. AUTHORIZATION TO IMPOSE SUPPLEMENTAL MUNICIPAL GROSS RECEIPTS TAX <u>AND SUPPLEMENTAL MUNICIPAL</u> <u>COMPENSATING TAX</u>--AUTHORIZATION FOR ISSUANCE OF SUPPLEMENTAL MUNICIPAL GROSS RECEIPTS BONDS--ELECTION REQUIRED.--

A. The majority of the members elected to the governing body of a municipality may enact an ordinance imposing an excise tax on any person engaging in business in the municipality for the privilege of engaging in business in . 149642.1

1 the municipality. This tax is to be referred to as the "supplemental municipal gross receipts tax". 2 The rate of the tax shall not exceed one percent of the gross receipts of the 3 4 person engaging in business and shall be imposed in onefourth percent increments if less than one percent. 5 An ordinance imposing a tax authorized by 6 **B**. 7 Subsection A of this section shall also impose a tax for the privilege of using property in the municipality if the use or 8 service is subject to the compensating tax. This tax shall 9 10 be referred to as the "supplemental municipal compensating tax". The rate of the tax imposed pursuant to this 11 12 subsection shall be the same as the rate of tax imposed pursuant to Subsection A of this section. If, at the time 13 this 2004 act becomes effective, a municipality has in effect 14 any amount of supplemental municipal gross receipts tax, a 15 supplemental municipal compensating tax is hereby imposed at 16 the same rate, effective on the effective date of this 2004 17 18 act.

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[B-] <u>C.</u> The governing body of a municipality enacting an ordinance imposing the [tax] <u>taxes</u> authorized in [Subsection A] <u>Subsections A and B</u> of this section shall submit the question of imposing [such tax] <u>the taxes</u> and the question of the issuance of supplemental municipal gross receipts bonds in an amount not to exceed nine million dollars (\$9,000,000), for which the revenue from the . 149642.1

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supplemental municipal gross receipts tax and supplemental municipal compensating tax is dedicated, to the qualified electors of the municipality at a regular or special 3 4 election.

[C.] D. The questions referred to in Subsection [B] C of this section shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the municipality as two separate ballot questions, which shall be substantially in the following form

"Shall the municipality be authorized to (1) issue supplemental municipal gross receipts bonds in an amount of not exceeding _____ dollars for the purpose of constructing and equipping and otherwise acquiring a municipal water supply system?

For ______ Against _____"; and (2) "Shall the municipality impose an excise tax for the privilege of engaging in business in the municipality which shall be known as the "supplemental municipal gross receipts tax" and an excise tax on the use of property in the municipality which shall be known as the "supplemental municipal compensating tax", both of which shall be imposed at a rate of _____ percent [of the gross receipts of the person engaging in business], the proceeds of which are dedicated to the payment of supplemental municipal gross receipts bonds?

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For ______ Against _____".

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[D.] <u>E.</u> Only those voters who are registered electors who reside within the municipality shall be permitted to vote on these two questions. The procedures for conducting the election shall be substantially the same as the applicable provisions in Sections 3-30-1, 3-30-6 and 3-30-7 NMSA 1978 relating to municipal debt.

[$\underline{\mathbf{F}}$.] $\underline{\mathbf{F}}$. If at an election called pursuant to this section a majority of the voters voting on each of the two questions vote in the affirmative on each [$\underline{\mathbf{such}}$] question, [$\underline{\mathbf{then}}$] the ordinance imposing the supplemental municipal gross receipts tax <u>and supplemental municipal compensating</u> <u>tax</u> shall be approved. If at such election a majority of the voters voting on such questions [$\underline{\mathbf{fail}}$] <u>fails</u> to approve any of the questions, [$\underline{\mathbf{then}}$] the ordinance imposing the [$\underline{\mathbf{tax}}$] <u>taxes</u> shall be disapproved and the questions required to be submitted by Subsection [$\underline{\mathbf{B}}$] $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ of this section shall not be submitted to the voters for a period of one year from the date of the election.

[F.] <u>G.</u> Any ordinance enacted under the provisions of this section shall include an effective date of either July 1 or January 1, whichever date occurs first after the expiration of at least [five] three months from the date of the election. A certified copy of any ordinance imposing a supplemental municipal gross receipts tax <u>and supplemental</u>

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1 <u>municipal compensating tax</u> shall be mailed to the [division] 2 <u>department</u> within five days after the ordinance is adopted by 3 the approval by the electorate. Any ordinance repealing the 4 imposition of a tax under the provisions of the Supplemental 5 Municipal Gross Receipts Tax Act shall become effective on either July 1 or January 1, after the expiration of at least 6 7 [five] three months from the date the ordinance is repealed by the governing body. 8

[G.-] <u>H.</u> Nothing in this section is intended to or does alter the effectiveness or validity of any actions taken in accordance with Subsection G of Section 80 of Chapter 20 of Laws 1986."

Section 10. Section 7-19-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, Chapter 397, Section 4) is amended to read:

"7-19-13. ORDINANCE [MUST] SHALL CONFORM TO CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE GROSS RECEIPTS AND COMPENSATING TAX ACT AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE [DIVISION] DEPARTMENT. --

A. Any ordinance imposing a supplemental municipal gross receipts tax <u>and supplemental municipal</u> <u>compensating tax</u> shall adopt by reference the same definitions and the same provisions relating to exemptions and deductions as are contained in the Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act then in effect and as it may be amended from time to time.

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B. The governing body of any municipality

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imposing or increasing the supplemental municipal gross receipts tax [must] and supplemental municipal compensating tax shall adopt the language of the model ordinance furnished to the municipality by the [division] department for the portion of the ordinance relating to the [tax] taxes."

Section 11. Section 7-19-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, Chapter 397, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:

"7-19-15. COLLECTION BY DEPARTMENT--TRANSFER OF PROCEEDS--DEDUCTIONS.--

A. The department shall collect the supplemental municipal gross receipts tax in the same manner and at the same time it collects the state gross receipts tax. <u>The</u> <u>department shall collect the supplemental municipal</u> <u>compensating tax in the same manner and at the same time it</u> <u>collects the compensating tax.</u>

B. The department shall withhold an administrative fee pursuant to Section [1 of this 1997 act] 7-1-6.41 NMSA 1978. The department shall transfer to each municipality for which it is collecting a supplemental municipal gross receipts tax the amount of the tax collected less the administrative fee withheld and less any disbursements for tax credits, refunds and the payment of interest applicable to the supplemental municipal gross receipts tax. The department shall transfer to each municipality for which it is collecting a supplemental . 149642.1
