14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. Section 34-1-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
16	Chapter 278, Section 1) is amended to read:
17	"34-1-9. SALARIES OF JUSTICES, JUDGES AND MAGISTRATES
18	A. Justices of the supreme court shall each receive
19	an annual salary [of seventy-seven thousand two hundred fifty
20	dollars (\$77,250)] <u>as provided by the legislature</u> . The chief
21	justice of the supreme court shall receive an annual salary
22	that is two thousand dollars (\$2,000) more than the annual
23	salary of a justice of the supreme court.
24	B. The chief judge of:

7	annual salary that is ninety percent of the annual salary of

9	(4) a magistrate district consisting of three

13	C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or
14	any other provision of this section, the annual salaries of the
15	following judges and magistrates shall be established as

20	(2) a district court judge shall receive an

1 (4) a full-time magistrate shall receive an annual salary that is seventy-five percent of the annual salary 2 3 of a metropolitan court judge; 4 a half-time magistrate shall receive an (5) annual salary that is fifty percent of the annual salary of a 5 full-time magistrate; and 6 7 (6) a quarter-time magistrate shall receive an annual salary that is twenty-five percent of the annual salary 8 of a full-time magistrate. 9 10 For [the eighty-third] fiscal year 1995 and all D. subsequent fiscal years, the annual salary for justices of the 11 12 supreme court, judges of the court of appeals, district court judges, metropolitan court judges and magistrates shall be 13 established by the legislature in an appropriations act. 14 Ε. No additional salaries shall be paid to 15 justices, judges or magistrates on account of services rendered 16 the state. Justices of the supreme court, judges of the court 17 of appeals, district court judges, metropolitan court judges 18 and magistrates shall receive per diem and mileage for 19 necessary travel on official business of the court as provided 20 in the Per Diem and Mileage Act." 21 Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Thirty-two thousand four 22 hundred dollars (\$32,400) is appropriated from the general fund 23 to the administrative office of the courts for expenditure in 24
