 AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAID; REQUIRING THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY AND COST-BENEFIT ANALYSIS THAT WOULD TRANSFER CERTAIN POPULATION GROUPS TO THE MEDICARE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Public Assistance Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] MEDICAID POPULATION GROUPS TRANSFERRED TO MEDICARE.--The department shall conduct a study and costbenefit analysis, in collaboration with the federal centers for medicare and medicaid services, to determine the feasibility and cost-benefit analysis of a process that would transfer certain population groups from the New Mexico medicaid program to the federal medicare program. The department's study and .150117.1

analysis shall include:

A. an evaluation of Title 18, Title 19 and Title 21 of the federal Social Security Act to determine what medicaideligible individuals are eligible for but not enrolled in the medicare program;

- B. an analysis of the direct and indirect costs that would be incurred by the state and the federal government, respectively, if medicaid were to assume responsibility for the health care of children from birth to age eighteen and who are in households with incomes up to two hundred thirty-five percent of the federal poverty level and if medicare were to assume responsibility for the health care of adults nineteen years to sixty-four years of age who are in households with incomes up to two hundred percent of the poverty level;
- C. an analysis of the types of service currently provided by medicaid and medicare and what services would be gained or lost if an individual transferred from one program to another;
- D. ongoing dialogue with the New Mexico congressional delegation to determine what resources and support would be needed for such a study and analysis;
- E. an analysis of the economic impact of providing compensated health care to all New Mexicans; and
- F. a report with findings and recommendations to the legislative health and human services committee and the .150117.1 $\,$

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       legislative finance committee by November 1, 2004."
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
