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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
9	Section 1. Section 66-5-65 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
10	Chapter 14, Section 14, as amended) is amended to read:
11	"66-5-65. CLASSIFICATIONSENDORSEMENTS
12	RESTRICTIONS
13	A. Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with
14	the classifications, endorsements and restrictions enumerated
15	in Subsections B, C and D of this section. The holder of a
16	valid commercial driver's license may drive all vehicles in
17	the class for which that license is issued and all lesser
18	classes of vehicles except motorcycles and vehicles that
19	require an endorsement, unless the proper endorsement appears
20	on the license.
21	B. The following classifications shall apply to
22	commercial driver's licenses:
23	(1) class A - any combination of vehicles
24	with a gross combination weight rating of more than
25	twenty-six thousand pounds, if the gross vehicle weight SB 40 Page 1

1 rating of the vehicle or vehicles being towed is in excess of 2 ten thousand pounds; 3 (2) class B - any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than twenty-six thousand 4 5 pounds and any such vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross 6 vehicle weight rating of ten thousand pounds or less; and (3) class C - any single vehicle or 7 combination of vehicles that does not meet either the 8 definition of Paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection but is: 9 (a) designed to transport sixteen or 10 more passengers, including the driver; or 11 (b) used in the transportation of 12 hazardous materials, which requires the vehicle to be 13 placarded under applicable law. 14 15 C. The secretary, by regulation, may provide for classifications in addition to those set forth in Subsection 16 B of this section. 17 The following endorsements and restrictions D. 18 shall apply to commercial driver's licenses: 19 (1) "H" - authorizes driving a vehicle 20 transporting hazardous material; 21 "L" - restricts the driver to vehicles (2)22 not equipped with airbrakes; 23 "T" - authorizes driving a vehicle 24 (3) towing more than one trailer; 25

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"P" - authorizes driving vehicles, other 1 (4) 2 than school buses, carrying passengers; 3 (5) "N" - authorizes driving tank vehicles; "X" - represents a combination of the (6) 4 5 hazardous material ("H") and tank vehicle ("N") endorsements; "S" - authorizes driving a school bus; 6 (7) 7 and 8 (8) "K" - restricts the driver to driving a 9 commercial motor vehicle in intrastate commerce only. 10 Ε. The department shall require an applicant requesting a hazardous material ("H") endorsement to be 11 subject to a background check pursuant to the federal Uniting 12 and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools 13 Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism Act of 2001." 14 15 Section 2. REPEAL.--Section 74-4F-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 37, Section 3) is repealed. 16 Section 3.
