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AN ACT

RELATING TO FINANCE; REVOKING LEGISLATIVE AUTHORIZATION TO THE NEW MEXICO FINANCE AUTHORITY TO MAKE LOANS FROM THE PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC PROJECTS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: Section 1. PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND--REVOCATION 8 OF LEGISLATIVE AUTHORIZATION. -- The legislative authorization granted to the New Mexico finance authority, pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-21-6 NMSA 1978, to make loans from the public project revolving fund is revoked with respect to 12 the following qualified entities for the specified public 13 projects: 14
