6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:			
7	WHEREAS, Section 13-6-3 NMSA 1978 requires legislative			
8	ratification and approval of a sale of real property of the			
9	state for a consideration of one hundred thousand dollars			
10	(\$100,000) or more; and			
11	WHEREAS, the Cottonwood-Walnut Creek property was			
12	purchased in 1972 for the purpose of creating a state park;			
13	and			
14	WHEREAS, plans to proceed with a state park changed due			
15	to the development of another state park in the same area and			
16	a lack of progress in implementing a dam project originally			
17	envisioned; and			
18	WHEREAS, the state parks division of the energy,			
19	minerals and natural resources department has leased the			
20	Cottonwood-Walnut Creek property for agricultural use from			
21	1974 to 2004; and			
22	WHEREAS, the state parks division has terminated the			
23	lease effective February 15, 2004 in expectation of disposing			
24	of the property; and			
25	WHEREAS, the state parks division plans to use the			

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1	proceeds from the	e sale of the Cottonwood-Walnut Creek	
2	property to match federal funds for state park land		
3	acquisition and development in other locations; and		
4	WHEREAS, the Cottonwood-Walnut Creek property is located		
5	in Eddy county and legally described as:		
6	Township 16 South, Range 25 East, N.M.P.M.

Lumley, all oil 2 gas and other minerals not heretofore 3 reserved; and SUBJECT TO the oil and gas lease on record on February 13, 1972, 4 5 provided however, that any future oil gas or mineral leases or conveyances 6 entered into by the grantor Geraldine L. 7 Lumley, or her heirs or assigns, shall 8 carry a provision that said lessees or 9 grantees will not create, or permit to 10 exist, any unsightly excavation fills, 11 or installations, or drill for or 12 explore for oil, gas or any other 13 minerals on the said lands, or permit 14 15 waste on said property in any location which will interfere with or create a 16 condition that would interfere with the 17 use by the grantee or the general public 18 in the use of said lands for park and 19 20 recreation purposes, or which will impair the scenic or esthetic value of 21 such land. 22 With warranty covenants."; and 23 WHEREAS, Section 16-2-11 NMSA 1978 requires legislative 24 SJR 5 approval of acquisition of lands for state park or recreation 25 Page 3 purposes; and

WHEREAS, the state parks division should be authorized to purchase lands adjacent to Sugarite and Manzano state parks;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the sale of the described property be hereby ratified and approved pursuant to Section 13-6-3 NMSA 1978; and

10 authorized to purchase lands adjacent to Sugarite and Manzano
11 state parks; and
