PROVIDE A SUSTAINABLE REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY FOR AREAS WITHIN
THE PECOS RIVER SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the United States supreme court has found that New Mexico has undelivered water to Texas under the Pecos River Compact; and

WHEREAS, the Rio Bonito is a tributary of the Pecos river, and Bonito lake, located at the headwaters of the Rio Bonito, impounds water that is then conveyed westerly into the Tularosa basin, a basin that is not hydrologically connected to the Pecos river system; and

16 WHEREAS, the out-of-basin conveyance of water from a 17 river tributary to the Pecos river affects the flows into the 18 Pecos river; and

WHEREAS, planning documents developed by water users in the Tularosa basin indicate their intention to ultimately end their reliance on diversions from Bonito lake; and

WHEREAS, the current drought has demonstrated that for the Ruidoso area, nestled in the southern Rocky mountains and on the western edge of the Pecos river system, continued reliance on existing surface and ground water supplies may be SM 19

problematic; and

WHEREAS, the Ruidoso area requires additional water supplies in order to provide a sustainable water supply for its existing population; and

WHEREAS, Bonito lake could aid the state in meeting its delivery obligations to Texas under the Pecos River Compact and at the same time provide a much-needed water supply for the Ruidoso area; and

9 WHEREAS, meeting New Mexico's obligations on the Pecos
10 river is a matter of statewide public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the interstate stream commission be requested to investigate the potential to use water from Bonito lake to aid the state in meeting its delivery obligations under the Pecos River Compact while simultaneously providing a water supply for the Ruidoso area; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the interstate stream 19 commission be requested to investigate the potential of 20 alternate sources of supply for water users in the Tularosa 21 basin, including analysis of using brackish waters and water 22 from the Salt basin in southern Otero county, to ensure that 23 Otero county continues to have abundant water supplies for 24 its entire population and for future economic expansion and 25 population growth; and

3	interest, the potential issuance of state-issued general	
4	obligation bonds to provide funds for alternate water	
5	supplies for the Ruidoso and Alamogordo areas should be	
6	pursued expeditiously; and	
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the interstate stream	
8	commission make a report of its investigations to the	
9	appropriate interim water committee; and	
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be	
11	transmitted to the interstate stream commission and the New
