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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
9	Section 1. Section 66-5-65 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 14,
10	Section 14, as amended) is amended to read:
11	"66-5-65. CLASSIFICATIONSENDORSEMENTSRESTRICTIONS
12	A. Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with the
13	classifications, endorsements and restrictions enumerated in Subsections B, C and
14	D of this section. The holder of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all
15	vehicles in the class for which that license is issued and all lesser classes of
16	vehicles except motorcycles and vehicles that require an endorsement, unless the
17	proper endorsement appears on the license.
18	B. The following classifications shall apply to commercial driver's
19	licenses:
20	(1) class A - any combination of vehicles with a gross
21	combination weight rating of more than
22	twenty-six thousand pounds, if the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle or
23	vehicles being towed is in excess of ten thousand pounds;
24	(2) class B - any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight
25	rating of more than twenty-six thousand pounds and any such vehicle towing a
	vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand pounds or less; and
	(3) class C - any single vehicle or combination of vehicles

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1	that does not meet either the definition of Paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection but
2	is:
3	(a) designed to transport sixteen or more passengers,
4	including the driver; or
5	(b) used in the transportation of hazardous materials,
6	which requires the vehicle to be placarded under applicable law.
7	C. The secretary, by regulation, may provide for classifications in
8	addition to those set forth in Subsection B of this section.
9	D. The following endorsements and restrictions shall apply to
10	commercial driver's licenses:
11	(1) "H" - authorizes driving a vehicle transporting hazardous
12	material;
13	(2) "L" - restricts the driver to vehicles not equipped with
14	airbrakes;
15	(3) "T" - authorizes driving a vehicle towing more than one
16	trailer;
17	(4) "P" - authorizes driving vehicles, other than school buses,
18	carrying passengers;
19	(5) "N" - authorizes driving tank vehicles;
20	(6) "X" - represents a combination of the hazardous material
21	("H") and tank vehicle ("N") endorsements;
22	(7) "S" - authorizes driving a school bus; and
23	(8) "K" - restricts the driver to driving a commercial motor
24	vehicle in intrastate commerce only.
25	E. The department shall require an applicant requesting a
	hazardous material ("H") endorsement to be subject to a background check
	pursuant to the federal Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate

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1	Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism Act of 2001.
2	Section 2. REPEALSection 74-4F-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,
3	Chapter 37, Section 3) is repealed.
4	Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
