11	A. The department shall establish a statewide assessment and	
12	accountability system that is aligned with the state academic content and	
13	performance standards and that measures adequate yearly progress for each	
14	student, public school and school district. Adequate yearly progress shall be	
15	determined primarily by student academic achievement, as demonstrated by	
16	statewide standards-based academic performance tests; however, the department	
17	may include other indicators of adequate yearly progress, including graduation rates	
18	for high schools and attendance for elementary and middle schools.	
19	B. The academic assessment program for adequate yearly progress	
20	shall test student achievement as follows by the school year indicated:	
21	(1) for grades kindergarten through two, diagnostic and	
22	standards-based tests on reading that include phonemic awareness, phonics and

10	C. The department shall involve appropriate licensed school

14	program. The department shall adopt standards for reasonable accommodations in
15	academic testing for students with disabilities and limited English proficiency,
16	including when and how accommodations may be applied. The legislative
17	education study committee shall review the standards prior to adoption by the

E. Students who have been determined to be limited English proficient may be allowed to take the standards-based academic performance test in their primary language. A student who has attended school for three consecutive years in the United States shall participate in the English language reading test unless granted a waiver by the department based on criteria established by the department. An English language reading test waiver may be granted only for a maximum of two additional years and only on a case-by-case basis."

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
