5	Section 1. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
6	read:
7	"SHORT TITLEChapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 may be cited as the
8	"Immunization Act"."
9	Section 2. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
10	read:
11	"IMMUNIZATION REGISTRYCREATIONThe department of health, in
12	conjunction with the human services department, shall establish and maintain a
13	state immunization registry. The registry shall be a single repository of accurate,
14	complete and current immunization records to aid, coordinate and promote effective
15	and cost-efficient disease prevention and control efforts."
16	Section 3. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
17	read:
18	"REPORTINGPhysicians, nurses and other health care providers may
19	report on immunization to the immunization registry unless the patient, or the
20	patient's guardian if the patient is a minor, refuses to allow reporting of this
21	information."
22	Section 4. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
23	read:
24	"ACCESSAccess to the information in the immunization registry shall be
25	limited to primary care physicians, nurses, school nurses, managed care
	organizations and other appropriate health care providers or public health entities
	as determined by the secretary of health; provided that a managed care

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1	organization shall be entitled to access information only for its enrollees."
2	Section 5. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
3	read:
4	"USEThe information contained in the immunization registry shall be used
5	for the following purposes:
6	A. to ensure that the registrants receive all recommended
7	immunizations in a timely manner by providing access to the registrant's
8	immunization record;
9	B. to improve immunization rates by facilitating notice to registrants
10	of overdue or upcoming immunizations; and
11	C. to control communicable diseases by assisting in the
12	identification of individuals who require immediate immunization in the event of a
13	disease outbreak."
14	Section 6. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
15	read:
16	"RULESThe secretary of health shall adopt rules for the immunization
17	registry pursuant to the Immunization Act concerning the following:
18	A. the implementation and maintenance of the registry;
19	B. requirements for content and submission of reports of
20	immunization to the registry;
21	C. procedures for the patient, or the patient's parent or guardian if
22	the patient is a minor, to decline to participate in the registry;
23	D. procedures for the registrant, or the registrant's parent or
24	guardian if the registrant is a minor, to review and correct information contained in
25	the registry;
	E. procedures for the registrant, or the registrant's parent or
	guardian if the registrant is a minor, to withdraw consent for participation at any time

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1	and to remove information from the registry;
2	F. limits on and methods of access to the registry by those
3	authorized to gain access; and
4	G. procedures for managed care organizations to obtain summary
5	statistics of immunization information on managed care organization members from
6	the registry."
7	Section 7. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
8	read:
9	"OBLIGATIONSNothing in the immunization registry is intended to affect
10	the obligations of persons to have their children immunized pursuant to the
11	Immunization Act."
12	Section 8. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
13	read:
14	"RIGHTSNothing in the Immunization Act shall preclude the right of the
15	patient, or the patient's parent or guardian if the patient is a minor, to claim
16	exemption from immunization as defined in Section 24-5-3 NMSA 1978; nor shall
17	anything in the Immunization Act require such patient to be included in the
18	immunization registry if the patient, or the patient's parent or guardian if the patient
19	is a minor, objects on any grounds, including that such registry conflicts with the
20	religious belief of the patient, or the patient's parent or guardian if the patient is a
21	minor."
22	Section 9. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted to
23	read:
24	"PARTICIPATIONNo health care provider shall discriminate in any way
25	against a person solely because that person elects not to participate in the
	immunization registry."

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Section 10. A new section of Chapter 24, Article 5 NMSA 1978 is enacted

1	to read:
2	"LIABILITYAny person reporting, receiving, using or disclosing information
3	to or from the immunization registry as authorized by the Immunization Act or by
4	any rule adopted pursuant to that act shall not be liable for civil damages of any kind
5	connected with such submission, use or disclosure of immunization information."
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
