Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 9 requests support and participation in a veterans' oral history project for New Mexico. Agencies named in the memorial include the Museum of New Mexico, Bataan Memorial Museum and Library, and the NM Veterans' Service Commission.

Significant Issues

New Mexico has always had a very rich and storied military history from Glorieta Pass to the 200th Coast Artillery that survived the Bataan Death March. This history includes New Mexico's Navajo Code Talkers and the Stealth Bomber Squadron that was the first to enter Bagdad.

New Mexico must preserve the personal stories of all of New Mexican heroes in uniform. This memorial encourages the collecting of these stories by our citizens so as to memorialize their heroic deeds.

TECHNICAL ISSUES
