#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 30 appropriates \$4.4 thousand from the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund to the Workers' Compensation Administration for the purpose of increasing the director's salary. Additionally, the bill decreases the amount of time a former ombudsman must wait to hold another job in an administration from five years to one year.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill changes the Workers' Compensation Administration director salary from 95 percent of district court judges to 95 percent of court of appeals judges. The appropriation of \$4.4 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 2005 shall revert to the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund.
