### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 236 appropriates \$75 thousand from the general fund to the Economic Development Department for the Fort Stanton Development Commission for the purpose of administering the Fort Stanton facility.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$75 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY05 shall not revert to the general fund.

### ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department indicates this funding will allow the commission to perform its duties and powers of crafting a long-term strategy for the protection and management of Fort Stanton. The Economic Development Department indicates the cost for rehabilitating the buildings at the facility are estimated at over \$1 million.
