SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

SenateBill 308 appropriates \$1,957,660 from the general fund to the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) to provide justices of the supreme court with a salary increase to \$110,000. Salary increases will also be provided to the chief justice of the supreme court, the chief judge of the court of appeals, the judges of the court of appeals, district court judges, metropolitan court judges, magistrate judges, child support hearing officers and special commissioners. The salary increases will be effective the first full pay period after July 1, 2004. The bill represents an 11 percent increase for all judges.

Significant Issues

Judicial salaries nationwide are constantly changing, yet New Mexico judicial salaries are consistently listed as one of the lowest in the nation. New Mexico currently ranks 54th when compared to judges in other state courts and judges in the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico,

the Northern Mariana Islands and the Virgin Islands.

If the salary increase is implemented, New Mexico's ranking would move to approximately 40th within the 50 state region. The AOC reports that in order to attract and retain the most qualified individuals to serve on the New Mexico bench, it is essential to pay them an appropriate salary.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$1,957.7 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2005.
