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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"Trauma System Fund Authority Act".
17	Section 2. PURPOSE OF ACTThe purpose of the Trauma
18	System Fund Authority Act is to provide funding to sustain
19	existing trauma centers, support the development of new trauma
20	centers and develop a statewide trauma system.
21	Section 3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Trauma System
22	Fund Authority Act:
23	A. "authority" means the trauma system fund
24	authority;
25	B. "department" means the department of health;
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1	C. "fund" means the trauma system fund;	
2	D. "secretary" means the secretary of health; and	
3	E. "statewide trauma system" means a coordinated	
4	continuum of care that includes injury prevention, emergency	
5	medical, acute care hospital and rehabilitative services and	
6	that is subject to accountability and system improvement.	
7	Section 4. TRAUMA SYSTEM FUND AUTHORITY CREATED	
8	MEMBERSHIP	
9	A. The "trauma system fund authority" is created.	
10	The authority is administratively attached to the department.	
11	B. The authority shall consist of at least nine	
12	members, all of whom shall be appointed by and serve at the	
13	pleasure of the governor. The membership of the authority	
14	shall include the following:	
15	(1) the secretary or the secretary's designee;	
16	(2) representation from the medical specialty	
17	of trauma physicians;	
18	(3) at least one member of a statewide	
19	organization representing physicians in New Mexico;	
20	(4) at least one member representing emergency	
21	and trauma nursing practice;	
22	(5) at least one member of a statewide	
23	organization representing hospitals and health systems in New	
24	Mexico;	
25	(6) at least one member of a statewide	
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1 organization representing injury prevention; 2 the chair of the statewide emergency (7) 3 medical services advisory committee; 4 (8) the chair of the trauma advisory 5 committee; and at least one member of a statewide 6 (9) 7 organization representing rehabilitation services. 8 Authority members shall elect a chair and other C. 9 officers as the authority deems appropriate. 10 D. The authority shall meet regularly at the call 11 of the chair. 12 Section 5. DUTIES.--The authority shall: 13 develop criteria by which distribution of funds Α. 14 to existing trauma centers and potential new centers will 15 occur; 16 receive applications and determine and monitor B. 17 the actual distribution of money from the fund that will 18 support the development of a statewide system of trauma care; 19 C. oversee the department's administration of the 20 fund and the development of a trauma system; and 21 report annually to the interim legislative D. 22 health and human services committee. 23 Section 6. TRAUMA SYSTEM FUND CREATED--FUNDING .--24 Α. The "trauma system fund" is created in the state 25 treasury. The fund shall consist of money appropriated and .159875.2GR - 3 -

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transferred to the fund, money received by the authority from any public or private source and tax revenues distributed to the fund by law. Interest earned on investment of the fund shall be credited to the fund. Disbursements from the fund shall be made upon warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of health or the secretary's authorized representative. Money in the fund shall not revert at the end of any fiscal year.

B. Money in the fund is appropriated to the department for the purpose of making distributions approved by the authority and for administering the Trauma System Fund Authority Act; provided that no more than five percent of the fund may be used by the department for administrative costs, including monitoring, trauma system development and providing technical assistance.

Section 7. RULES.--The department shall promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of the Trauma System Fund Authority Act.

Section 8. APPROPRIATION. --

A. Six million dollars (\$6,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the trauma system fund for expenditure by the department of health in fiscal year 2006 and subsequent fiscal years as follows:
