AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAID; ADDING AN ELIGIBILITY CATEGORY FOR ADULTS IN HOUSEHOLDS WITH INCOMES LESS THAN ONE HUNDRED PERCENT OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY GUIDELINES; AMENDING SECTION 27-2B-15 NMSA 1978 (BEING LAWS 1998, CHAPTER 8, SECTION 15 AND LAWS 1998, CHAPTER 9, SECTION 15, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 2001, CHAPTER 295, SECTION 8 AND BY LAWS 2001, CHAPTER 326, SECTION 8).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 27-2B-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1998, Chapter 8, Section 15 and Laws 1998, Chapter 9, Section 15, as amended by Laws 2001, Chapter 295, Section 8 and by Laws 2001, Chapter 326, Section 8) is amended to read:

"27-2B-15. MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY.--

- The following are eligible for medicaid:
 - a participant who is in transition to

22	(9) a foster child in the custody of the state
23	or of an Indian pueblo, tribe or nation who meets eligibility
