16	Section 1. Section 61-9A-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
17	Chapter 49, Section 16, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"61-9A-16. TEMPORARY LICENSURE
19	<u>A.</u> Prior to examination, an applicant for licensure
20	may obtain a temporary license to engage in any counselor and
21	therapist practice if the person meets all of the requirements,
22	except examination, provided for in Section 61-9A-10, 61-9A-11,
23	<u>61-9A-11.1</u> , 61-9A-12, <u>61-9A-12.1</u> , 61-9A-13, [ <del>or</del> ] 61-9A-14,
24	61-9A-14.1 or 61-9A-14.2 NMSA 1978. The temporary license
25	shall be valid no more than sixty days after the results of the

shall automatically expire and the applicant will not be
reissued a temporary license.

5 B. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A 6 of this section, as deemed necessary by the board, an applicant 7 for licensure pursuant to the Counseling and Therapy Practice 8 Act may be issued a temporary license for a period not to 9 exceed six months or for a period of time necessary for the 10 board to ensure that the applicant has met licensure 11 requirements as set out in that act."

Section 2. Section 61-9A-22 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, Chapter 49, Section 22, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-9A-22. LICENSURE BY CREDENTIALS--RECIPROCITY.--

<u>A.</u> The board may issue a license <u>in the same</u> <u>licensure level</u> to a person who:

(1) files a completed application accompanied by the required fees [and who];

(2) submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant holds <u>and has held for a minimum of five years</u> a current license issued by the appropriate examining board under the law of any other state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia or any foreign nation and is: [A.] (a) a nationally certified counselor as determined by the national board of certified
