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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONROADLESS AREAS REVIEW
16	TASK FORCE CREATEDMEMBERSHIPAPPOINTMENT
17	A. The "roadless areas review task force" is
18	created. The task force shall function from the effective date
19	of this act through November 15, 2006.
20	B. The roadless areas review task force shall be
21	convened and chaired by the secretary of energy, minerals and
22	natural resources or the secretary's designee, who may contract
23	with a mediator or other third party to facilitate the duties
24	of the task force. The secretary shall provide staff for the
25	task force.
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1	C. The other twelve members of the task force shall
2	be appointed as follows:
3	(1) the governor shall appoint eight members
4	from areas of the state adjacent to or containing designated
5	roadless areas, including:
6	(a) one person with expertise in fish
7	and wildlife biology; and
8	(b) one representative each from a
9	tribal or pueblo government, a county government, an off-
10	highway recreational vehicle organization, an agricultural
11	organization, a community land grant, an outfitters or guides
12	organization and an environmental organization;
13	(2) the speaker of the house of
14	representatives shall appoint two members; and
15	(3) the president pro tempore of the senate
16	shall appoint two members.
17	D. The roadless areas review task force shall:
18	(1) by September 15, 2006, hold public
19	meetings to review new federal forest service rules on
20	designation of New Mexico roadless areas. The public meetings
21	shall be held at the State Capitol and in Alamogordo, Carlsbad,
22	Carrizozo, Espanola, Grants, Las Vegas, Lordsburg, Mountainair,
23	Raton, Reserve, Silver City, Socorro, Springer and Taos;
24	(2) solicit and consider written and oral
25	comments on federal rules regarding roadless area designation
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1 and conservation issued by the United States department of 2 agriculture as a starting point for deliberations; and 3 (3) make formal recommendations by September 30, 2006, each of which shall require the affirmative consent 4 5 of eight members of the task force, to the governor for the governor's petition to the United States secretary of 6 7 agriculture regarding conservation of areas designated as 8 roadless areas by the United States department of agriculture. 9 Ε. The roadless areas review task force may 10 recommend to the governor for inclusion in his petition, based 11 on approval of eight members, boundary adjustments to federal 12 roadless area conservation rules and designations and 13 improvements to federal management of roadless areas. 14 Section 2. APPROPRIATION.--Five hundred thousand dollars 15 (\$500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the energy, 16 minerals and natural resources department for expenditure in 17 fiscal years 2006 and 2007 to accomplish the purposes of this 18 act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the 19 end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
