The appropriations in Subsection A of this 3 section shall be used for the costs of housing individuals 4 charged with or convicted of a violation of state law who: 5 have violated parole or are charged with a (1)6 parole violation; 7 while on parole, are charged with a (2) violation of local, state, tribal, federal or international 8 9 law; 10 are awaiting transportation and commitment (3) 11 to the corrections department following the pronouncement of a 12 judgment, sentence or an order of confinement; 13 (4) are charged with a violation of probation 14 by the corrections department or by a district court; 15 are sentenced, ordered or removed by the (5) 16 district court to incarceration in a county detention facility 17 for a felony conviction; or 18 (6) are incarcerated on the basis of an 19 arrest-and-hold order on a warrant issued by the corrections 20 department. 21 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining C. 22 at the end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the general 23 fund. 24 - 2 -25 .160883.1
