15	Section 1. A new Section 30-3-9.2 NMSA 1978 is enacted to

19	A. As used in this section:
20	(1) "health facility" means a public or
21	private hospital, outpatient facility, diagnostic and treatment
22	center, rehabilitation center or infirmary. "Health facility"
23	also includes those facilities that, by federal regulation,
24	must be licensed by the state to obtain or maintain full or
25	partial, permanent or temporary federal funding;

1 (2) "health care worker" means an employee of 2 a health facility who is subject to professional licensure or 3 who provides direct unsupervised patient care in an inpatient 4 setting; and 5 "in the lawful discharge of the health (3) care worker's duties" means engaged in the performance of the 6 7 duties of a health care worker. 8 Assault upon a health care worker consists of: Β. an attempt to commit a battery upon the 9 (1)10 person of a health care worker who is in the lawful discharge 11 of the health care worker's duties; or 12 any unlawful act, threat or menacing (2) 13 conduct that causes a health care worker who is in the lawful 14 discharge of the health care worker's duties to reasonably 15 believe that the health care worker is in danger of receiving 16 an immediate battery. 17 Whoever commits assault upon a health care worker is 18 guilty of a misdemeanor. 19 C. Aggravated assault upon a health care worker 20 consists of: 21 (1) unlawfully assaulting or striking at a 22 health care worker with a weapon while the health care worker 23 is in the lawful discharge of the health care worker's duties; 24 or 25 (2) willfully and intentionally assaulting a

health care worker who is in the lawful discharge of the health care worker's duties with intent to commit any felony.

Whoever commits aggravated assault upon a health care worker is guilty of a third degree felony.

D. Assault with intent to commit a violent felony upon a health care worker consists of assaulting a health care worker who is in the lawful discharge of the health care worker's duties with intent to kill the health care worker.

Whoever commits assault with intent to commit a violent felony upon a health care worker is guilty of a second degree felony.

E. Battery upon a health care worker is the unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of a health care worker who is in the lawful discharge of the health care worker's duties, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner.

Whoever commits battery upon a health care worker is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

F. Aggravated battery upon a health care worker consists of the unlawful touching or application of force to the person of a health care worker with intent to injure that health care worker while the health care worker is in the lawful discharge of the health care worker's duties.

Whoever commits aggravated battery upon a health care worker, inflicting an injury to the health care worker that is .160695.1

not likely to cause death or great bodily harm but does cause painful temporary disfigurement or temporary loss or impairment of the functions of any member or organ of the body, is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

Whoever commits aggravated battery upon a health care worker, inflicting great bodily harm or does so with a deadly weapon or in any manner whereby great bodily harm or death can be inflicted, is guilty of a third degree felony.

9 G. A person who assists or is assisted by one or 10 more other persons to commit a battery upon a health care 11 worker who is in the lawful discharge of the health care 12 worker's duties is guilty of a fourth degree felony."
