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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section l. A new section of the Severance Tax Bonding Act
18	is enacted to read:
19	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] AUTHORIZATION FOR SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR
20	SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUNDAPPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS
21	A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
22	severance tax bonds in fiscal years 2006 through 2011 in
23	compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not
24	exceeding a total of two hundred fifty million dollars
25	(\$250,000,000) when the department of transportation certifies
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the need for the issuance of the bonds; provided that no more than fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000) of severance tax bonding capacity may be utilized in any one fiscal year. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that, based upon a certification from the department of transportation, the proceeds of the bonds are needed and that the projects can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The state board of finance may issue and sell the bonds in the same manner as other severance tax bonds in an amount not to exceed the authorized amount provided for in this subsection. Any amount not certified for issuance in a fiscal year may be carried forward and credited against the amount to be certified in subsequent fiscal years.

B. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the severance tax transportation fund for distribution as directed by the department of transportation for projects pursuant to Section 6-21-6.11 NMSA 1978.

C. Money from the severance tax bonds provided for in this section shall not be used to pay indirect costs. If the department of transportation has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by April 1, 2011, the authorization .161049.3

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provided in this section shall expire."

Section 2. A new section of the New Mexico Finance Authority Act, Section 6-21-6.11 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

"6-21-6.11. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND--DISTRIBUTIONS.--

A. The "severance tax transportation fund" is created within the authority. The fund shall be administered by the authority as a separate account, but may consist of subaccounts if the authority deems them necessary to carry out the purpose of the fund. The fund shall consist of severance tax bond proceeds appropriated to the fund and, except as provided in Subsection E of this section, all earnings of the fund.

B. Except as provided in Subsection D of this section, upon certification by the department of transportation that a project has been approved for payment and upon compliance with the requirements of this section, money in the fund shall be distributed to the local governments for projects specifically authorized by the legislature. The department of transportation shall submit all invoices related to projects to the authority for payment. The authority shall issue payment to the local government named in the project application and certification.

C. Except as provided in Subsection D of this section, distributions from the fund shall be made pursuant to .161049.3

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1 the following criteria: 2 (1)the department of transportation shall 3 establish funding priorities and qualifications for the 4 transportation projects that are certified for funding from the 5 fund; distributions from the fund shall be used 6 (2)7 to pay the state's portion of the total cost necessary to 8 develop and construct the project; 9 (3) to qualify for funding, the local 10 government shall apply for funding through the department of 11 transportation's regional or metropolitan planning 12 organizations; 13 (4) the local government shall show, to the 14 satisfaction of the department of transportation, that it will 15 match the distribution from the severance tax transportation 16 fund in the following amounts: 17 (a) for a project with a total cost of 18 one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or less, the local government 19 shall contribute ten percent of the total project cost; 20 for a project with a total cost (b) 21 greater than one million dollars (\$1,000,000), but less than or 22 equal to six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local government 23 shall contribute twenty percent of the total project cost; and 24 (c) for a project with a total project 25 cost greater than six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local .161049.3 - 4 -

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1 government shall contribute thirty percent of the total project 2 cost; and

3 in determining the sufficiency of a local (5) 4 government's matching contribution, the department shall 5 consider actual funds, in-kind contributions, preconstruction 6 design and development costs and other related expenditures 7 made in the furtherance of the project. Matching fund sources 8 may be any money available to the local government for the 9 project, including: 10 (a) grants or loans by the authority 11 from the local transportation infrastructure fund; 12 (b) appropriations from local government 13 road funds; 14 community development block grants; (c) 15 or 16 (d) available federal funds. 17 D. Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsections 18 B and C of this section: 19 (1) up to twenty-five million dollars 20 (\$25,000,000) shall be distributed from the fund in fiscal 21 years 2006 through 2009 for the acquisition of rights of way, 22 planning, design and construction of drainage and paving 23 improvements for transportation access to the spaceport in 24 Sierra county and Dona Ana county, which shall be funded from 25 the fund without a requirement for a local match and which .161049.3 - 5 -

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1	shall have the highest funding priority; and			
2	(2) up to five hundred thousand dollars			
3	(\$500,000) of the fund may be expended by the department of			
4	transportation for engineering and design services to develop			
5	the projects funded with distributions from the fund.			
6	E. Earnings from investing the fund may be			
7	distributed by the authority to the department of			
8	transportation to be used for payment of administrative costs			
9	associated with the fund, including payment for engineering			
10	costs.			
11	F. As used in this section:			
12	(1) "fund" means the severance tax			
13	transportation fund; and			
14	(2) "local government" means a municipality			
15	acting within its planning and platting jurisdiction, a county			
16	or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo."

18	DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND			
19	Pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-21-6.11 NMSA 1978, upon			
20	certification by the department of transportation that the need			
21	exists for a distribution from the severance tax transportation			
22	fund and pursuant to the requirements of that section, the
