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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. A new section of the Income Tax Act is enacted
16	to read:
17	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ANGEL INVESTMENT CREDIT
18	A. To encourage investment in qualified businesses,
19	any taxpayer who files an individual New Mexico income tax
20	return, who is not a dependent of another taxpayer and who
21	makes a qualified investment may claim a credit in an amount
22	not to exceed twenty-five percent of not more than one hundred
23	thousand dollars (\$100,000) of the qualified investment. The
24	tax credit shall be known as the "angel investment credit".
25	B. A taxpayer may claim the angel investment credit

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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete for not more than three qualified investments for each taxable year in which the taxpayer makes a qualified investment; provided that each investment is in a different qualified business. A taxpayer may claim the angel investment credit for a qualified investment made in the same qualified business or successor of that business for not more than three years.

C. A taxpayer may claim the angel investment credit no later than one year following the end of the calendar year in which the qualified investment was made; provided that a claim for the credit may not be made or allowed with respect to any investment made after December 31, 2010. A claim for the angel investment credit shall not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for each qualified investment made by the taxpayer.

D. A husband and wife who file separate returns for a taxable year in which they could have filed a joint return may each claim one-half of the credit that would have been allowed on a joint return.

E. The angel investment credit may only be deducted from the taxpayer's income tax liability. Any portion of the tax credit provided by this section that remains unused at the end of the taxpayer's taxable year may be carried forward for three consecutive years; provided that the total tax credits claimed under this section shall not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for each qualified investment made .160116.1

"qualified investment" means a cash (6) investment in a qualified business for equity, but does not include an investment by a taxpayer if the taxpayer, a member 7 of the taxpayer's immediate family or an entity affiliated with 8 the taxpayer receives compensation from the qualified business 9 in exchange for services provided to the qualified business 10 within one year of investment in the qualified business."

Section 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION.--For taxable years 2012 through 2014, a taxpayer may carry forward amounts resulting from angel investment credits claimed and approved for qualified investments made in the calendar year 2009, 2010 or 2011.

Section 3. DELAYED REPEAL.--Section 1 of this act is repealed effective January 1, 2012.

Section 4. APPLICABILITY.--The provisions of this act apply to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2006.

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
