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15	WHEREAS, New Mexicans properly demand that elected
16	officials and public servants carry out their duties ethically
17	and with integrity; and
18	WHEREAS, this public demand is manifested in the
19	Governmental Conduct Act and other laws, including the
20	Financial Disclosure Act, the Lobbyist Regulation Act and the
21	Campaign Reporting Act; and
22	WHEREAS, those laws do not uniformly apply to all elected
23	officials and public servants; and
24	WHEREAS, the secretary of state has primary responsibility
25	for enforcing those acts, but shares responsibility with the
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attorney general and district attorneys; and

WHEREAS, enforcement options include a mix of education with the goal of seeking voluntary compliance and civil and criminal penalties; and

WHEREAS, many states have created ethics commissions or agencies with broad jurisdiction and authority to enforce campaign finance, conflict of interest, lobbying and other ethics laws; and

9 WHEREAS, the periodic review of the practices of and
10 experiences in other states helps inform the legislature and
11 other policymakers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico legislative council, the secretary of state and the attorney general be requested to cooperate in the creation and staffing of a task force to examine the practices of and experiences in other states that have created ethics commissions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico legislative council, the secretary of state and the attorney general be requested to cooperate in appointing legislators, employees of those executive branch offices and members of the public to the task force; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its recommendations, if any, to the New Mexico legislative council, the secretary of state and the attorney general prior to the .160085.1
