A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO DIRECT THE APPROPRIATE INTERIM COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY AND DESIRABILITY OF REQUIRING EVERY NEW MEXICAN TO PROVIDE A DNA SAMPLE TO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, society has benefited from the use of DNA to help solve crimes, clear wrongly accused and convicted suspects and identify unknown persons; and

WHEREAS, DNA has become more useful than the use of fingerprints to identify people; and

WHEREAS, people are reluctant to routinely provide a DNA sample for a variety of reasons, including the stigma associated with it because of its use in the criminal justice system, the potential for misuse of genetic information contained within DNA and the value that individuals place on

their personal privacy; and
