AN ACT

RELATING TO THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION; ADDING TWO LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES TO THE COMMISSION AS PROVIDED BY LAWS 2003, CHAPTER 49, SECTION 4.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 15-1C-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1999, Chapter 16, Section 4, as amended by Laws 2003, Chapter 49, Section 4 and by Laws 2003, Chapter 308, Section 4) is amended to read:

"15-1C-4. COMMISSION CREATED--MEMBERSHIP.--

A. The "information technology commission" is created. The commission consists of [~~thirteen~~] fifteen members as follows:

- (1) five members appointed by the governor, three of whom are from agencies whose primary funding is not

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1 from internal service funds;

2 (2) one staff member with telecommunications  
3 regulatory experience appointed by the [~~chairman~~] chair of the  
4 public regulation commission;

5 (3) two members representing education, one  
6 appointed by the [~~commission on~~] secretary of higher education  
7 and one appointed by the [~~president of the state board of~~]  
8 secretary of public education;

9 (4) two members from the national  
10 laboratories;

11 (5) three members appointed by the governor to  
12 represent the public with information technology and management  
13 experience, but who are not employees of the state or a  
14 political subdivision of the state and who do not have any  
15 financial interest in the state information systems or state  
16 contracts. The public members shall serve for staggered three-  
17 year terms; and

18 (6) two members representing local government,  
19 one appointed by the New Mexico association of counties and one  
20 appointed by the New Mexico municipal league.

21 B. Additionally, the following advisory members may  
22 serve on the commission:

23 (1) two members from the judicial information  
24 systems council appointed by the [~~chairman~~] chair of that  
25 council;

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1 (2) one staff member from the legislative  
2 council service and one staff member from the legislative  
3 finance committee, appointed by their respective directors; and

4 (3) the chief information officer.

5 C. Members of the commission, except the three  
6 public members appointed by the governor, may select designees  
7 to represent them and vote on their behalf.

8 D. The members of the commission who are not  
9 supported by public money, or their designees, may receive per  
10 diem and mileage pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act, but  
11 shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

12 E. The commission shall elect a [~~chairman~~] chair  
13 and vice [~~chairman~~] chair from the active membership of the  
14 commission for two-year terms.

15 F. The commission shall meet at least semiannually  
16 and may meet at the call of the [~~chairman~~] chair or a majority  
17 of the members."
