AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; PROHIBITING INTIMIDATION OF A JUDGE,
DISTRICT ATTORNEY OR PEACE OFFICER; PROHIBITING RETALIATION;
PROVIDING PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted
to read:

" [NEW MATERIAL] INTIMIDATION OF A JUDGE, DISTRICT
ATTORNEY OR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER- - RETALIATION. - -

A. Intimidation of a judge, district attorney or
peace officer consists of intimidating or threatening a judge,
district attorney or peace officer who is or may become
involved in a judicial, administrative, legislative or other
official cause or proceeding for the purpose of preventing or
influencing a ruling, prosecution, investigation or testimony.
