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15	WHEREAS, the workers' compensation administration is
16	charged with administering the workers' compensation laws of
17	this state; and
18	WHEREAS, current workers' compensation law applies to
19	employers of three or more workers in most cases; and
20	WHEREAS, current workers' compensation law allows an
21	exemption for farm and ranch laborers; and
22	WHEREAS, covering farm and ranch laborers could have a
23	significant fiscal impact for businesses and for the state; and
24	WHEREAS, eligibility for workers' compensation insurance
25	could have a significant impact on the farm and ranch laborers

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the workers' compensation administration be requested to create a task force to study the fiscal and policy implications of adding farm and ranch laborers to workers' compensation coverage; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the workers' compensation administration create a task force of equal numbers of persons who are actively engaged as farm and ranch business owners, persons who are farm and ranch laborers and their advocates and persons who are with the workers' compensation administration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the workers' compensation administration report to the appropriate interim committee the conclusions and recommendations of the task force by November 2007 and draft appropriate legislation in response to the conclusions of the task force; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the advisory council on workers' compensation and occupational disease disablement compensation, the workers' compensation administration, the secretary of labor and the governor.

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
