11	RELATING TO DOMESTIC AFFAIRS; ENACTING THE DOMESTIC PARTNER
12	RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES ACT.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"Domestic Partner Rights and Responsibilities Act".
17	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Domestic Partner
18	Rights and Responsibilities Act:
19	A. "affidavit of domestic partnership" means an
20	affidavit that identifies domestic partners and affirms that
21	both meet the requirements for entering into a domestic
22	partnership with each other as provided in the Domestic Partner
23	Rights and Responsibilities Act;
24	B. "certificate of domestic partnership" means a
25	certificate issued by the county clerk on behalf of the state,
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1 certifying the domestic partnership has been registered; 2 C. "common residence" means a residence shared by 3 registered domestic partners, even if one person temporarily 4 leaves the shared place of residence on either a short-term or 5 long-term basis; "domestic partner" means an adult who has chosen 6 D. 7 to share in another adult's life in a relationship of mutual 8 caring and support and who has established a domestic 9 partnership; 10 "domestic partnership" means the legal Ε. 11 relationship two domestic partners establish with each other, 12 provided the partners: 13 (1) share a common residence; 14 are, at minimum, at the age of majority; (2) 15 are capable of consenting; (3) 16 are not married to someone else and are (4) 17 not part of a valid domestic partnership or a civil union 18 recognized in another state; and 19 (5) are not related by blood in a way that 20 would prevent marriage under the laws of New Mexico; 21 "record of domestic partnership" means a F. 22 permanent record book kept by the county clerk of each county, 23 at the expense of each respective county in the state, for the 24 purpose of properly recording and indexing affidavits and 25 certificates of domestic partnerships and ensuring the .169867.1GR - 2 -

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affidavits and certificates of domestic partnerships are kept
 as county records; and

G. "registration fee" means twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to be paid by the domestic partners to the county clerk at the time of submitting an application for registration of domestic partnership.

Section 3. EQUAL RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES .--

A. A domestic partner has the same rights, protections, benefits and responsibilities under law as a spouse in a marriage. Definitions in law and rule applicable to marriage, including terms such as "next of kin", "spouse", "immediate family", "dependent", "parent", "stepparent", "children" or other term related to the spousal relationship shall apply equally to a domestic partnership.

B. A domestic partner who dissolves a domestic
partnership is subject to the same responsibilities,
obligations and duties under law, whether derived from statute,
rule, common law or other provisions or sources of law, as
those imposed on a spouse who dissolves a marriage.
Obligations imposed by law on a spouse in matters such as
dissolution of marriage and child support apply equally to a
domestic partner.

C. Following the death of a domestic partner, the surviving domestic partner has the same rights, protections and benefits and shall be subject to the same responsibilities, .169867.1GR

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1 obligations and duties under law as those granted to and 2 imposed upon a widow or a widower.

3 The parental rights and obligations of a D. domestic partner are the same as those of a spouse in a marriage.

6 Ε. In laws and policies regarding community 7 property, mutual responsibility for debts to third parties, 8 financial support, property ownership and other duties and 9 obligations, rights and responsibilities of marriage or marital 10 spouses, the date of registration of a domestic partnership 11 with the state is substituted for a date of marriage.

F. The state shall not discriminate against a domestic partner or domestic partnership on the grounds that the partner is not a spouse, a widow or widower or in a marriage.

G. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, in filing a state income tax return, a domestic partner shall use the same filing status as is used on a federal income tax return, or that would have been used if a federal income tax return had been filed. Earned income shall not be treated as community property for state income tax purposes.

JURISDICTION.--The district court has Section 4. jurisdiction over proceedings relating to domestic partnership, including dissolution, annulment and legal separation, and shall follow the same procedures as are used for spouses in a .169867.1GR - 4 -

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marriage, except that a dissolution, annulment or legal separation of a domestic partnership registered in this state may be filed in the district courts of this state if no other forum is available with comparable remedies to address distribution of assets, debts, support and other issues related thereto, even if neither domestic partner is a resident of, or maintains a domicile in, the state at the time the proceedings are filed. Nothing in this section shall be construed as granting jurisdiction in conflict with the Uniform Child-Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act as adopted in New Mexico.

Section 5. RECOGNITION OF LEGAL UNION.--A legal union other than the marriage of two persons formalized in another jurisdiction but substantially equivalent to a domestic partnership as defined in the Domestic Partner Rights and Responsibilities Act shall be recognized as a valid domestic partnership in this state regardless of whether it bears the name "domestic partnership".

Section 6. AFFIDAVIT REQUIRED--COUNTY CLERK--REGISTRATION FEES.--An adult prepared to form a domestic partnership shall obtain an affidavit of domestic partnership from the secretary of state or a county clerk and file it for recording in the county issuing the certificate of domestic partnership. A county clerk shall receive a registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for issuing and recording a certificate of .169867.1GR

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domestic partnership. Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) of each registration fee shall be remitted by the county treasurer to the state treasurer within fifteen days of the last day of each month, for credit to the children's trust fund.

Section 7. ESTABLISHING A DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP .--

A. A domestic partnership is established when the affidavit of domestic partnership is accepted and the certificate of domestic partnership is issued and recorded. The completed affidavit of domestic partnership shall be accepted by the county clerk, filed and recorded in the record of domestic partnership.

B. To obtain a certificate of domestic partnership, prospective domestic partners shall:

(1) submit an application for a certificate of domestic partnership and an affidavit of domestic partnership to a county clerk on a form that conforms with the requirements of the Domestic Partner Rights and Responsibilities Act stating that the domestic partners desire to become domestic partners and:

20 (a) currently share or will share a
21 common residence immediately upon becoming registered;
22 (b) have reached the age of majority;
23 (c) are capable of consenting to the

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domestic partnership;

(d) are not married to someone else and

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1 are not part of a valid domestic partnership or civil union to 2 someone else: and 3 (e) are not related by blood in a way 4 that would prevent marriage under the laws of New Mexico; 5 provide a mailing address; (2) 6 (3) state that they consent to the 7 jurisdiction of the district courts of New Mexico for the 8 purpose of a proceeding related to the domestic partnership 9 even if they are no longer a resident of or domiciled in this 10 state; 11 (4) sign the form with a declaration that 12 representations made in the form are true, correct and contain 13 no material omission of fact to the best knowledge and belief 14 of the applicants; 15 have a notary public acknowledge the (5) 16 Both partners' signatures shall be affixed to one signatures. 17 affidavit of domestic partnership form, which original 18 affidavit shall then be transmitted or delivered to the county 19 clerk according to the instructions provided on the affidavit; 20 and 21 pay the required registration fee. The county clerk shall immediately upon receipt 23 of the completed application and affidavit of domestic 24 partnership issue a certificate of domestic partnership, record 25 and index the certificate in the record of domestic partnership .169867.1GR - 7 -

After recording, the certificate of domestic partnership shall be returned to the 2 3 domestic partners. 4 Section 8. MISREPRESENTATION OF DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP 5 ELIGIBILITY.--Filing an intentionally and materially false 6 declaration of domestic partnership shall be punishable as a 7 misdemeanor. 8 Section 9. APPLICATION, AFFIDAVIT AND CERTIFICATE OF 9 DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP--FORMS .--10 An affidavit of domestic partnership shall be Α. 11 substantially as provided in this section, with each form to be 12 numbered consecutively corresponding with the page number of 13 the record book in the county clerk's office.
