## Bill Summary:

HB 425 makes an appropriation for after-school learning centers in the Mountainair Public Schools.

## Fiscal Impact:

$\$ 225,000$ is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Education Department (PED) for FY 09. The bill contains a reversion clause.

## Issues:

According the PED's analysis of HB 425, funds appropriated in HB 425 will be used to supplement federal funds for $21^{\text {st }}$ Century Community Learning Centers ( $21^{\text {st }}$ CCLC) in the Mountainair Public Schools. The $21^{\text {st }}$ CCLC federal grant funding is provided to grantees for a period of five years. Mountainair is in its last year of federal funding.

PED states that the purpose of the $21^{\text {st }}$ CCLC program is to provide opportunities for academic enrichment, including tutorial services to help students in high-poverty areas and those who attend low-performing schools meet state and local student performance standards in core academic subjects such as reading and mathematics. The centers are also required to provide a broad array of youth development activities and parent literacy for parents of students enrolled in the program.

Currently there are twenty-nine $21^{\text {st }}$ CCLC programs in New Mexico. The Legislature appropriated $\$ 1.5$ million for these programs in FY 08, of which $\$ 97,000$ went to Mountainair. Mountainair has a 2008 federal appropriation of $\$ 120,000$. The House Appropriations and Finance Committee Substitute for HB 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 10 appropriates $\$ 3.5$ million from the General Fund to PED for the after-school enrichment program, including $\$ 1.8$ million for $21^{\text {st }}$ Century Community Learning Centers statewide.
