AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS; ALLOWING FOR THE CONTINUATION OF  
FAMILY AND YOUTH RESOURCES PROGRAM GRANTS WHEN A SCHOOL'S  
POVERTY LEVEL FLUCTUATES; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-2D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,  
Chapter 153, Section 66) is amended to read:

"22-2D-3. PROGRAMS--PURPOSE--FUNCTIONS.--

A. A "family and youth resources program" may be  
created in any public school in the state. Except as provided  
in Subsection D of this section, the department shall accept  
applications for grants from public schools in which eighty  
percent of the students are eligible for the free or reduced-  
fee lunch program to fund their program.

B. The purpose of the program is to provide an

1 intermediary for students and their families at public schools  
2 to access social and health care services. The goal of the  
3 program is to forge mutual long-term relationships with public  
4 and private agencies and community-based, civic and corporate  
5 organizations to help students attain high academic achievement  
6 by meeting certain nonacademic needs of students and their  
7 families.

8 C. A program shall include the employment of a  
9 resource liaison, who shall:

10 (1) assess student and family needs and match  
11 those needs with appropriate public or private providers,  
12 including civic and corporate sponsors;

13 (2) make referrals to health care and social  
14 service providers;

15 (3) collaborate and coordinate with health and  
16 social service agencies and organizations through school-based  
17 and off-site delivery systems;

18 (4) recruit service providers and business,  
19 community and civic organizations to provide needed services  
20 and goods that are not otherwise available to a student or  
21 ~~[his]~~ the student's family;

22 (5) establish partnerships between the school  
23 and community organizations such as civic, business and  
24 professional groups and organizations; and recreational, social  
25 and after-school programs such as boys' and girls' clubs and

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1 boy and girl scouts;

2 (6) identify and coordinate age-appropriate  
3 resources for students in need of:

4 (a) counseling, training and placement  
5 for employment;

6 (b) drug and alcohol abuse counseling;

7 (c) family crisis counseling; and

8 (d) mental health counseling;

9 (7) promote family support and parent  
10 education programs; and

11 (8) seek out other services or goods a student  
12 or ~~[his]~~ the student's family needs to assist the student to  
13 stay in school and succeed.

14 D. A public school or group of public schools that  
15 has received a grant to establish a family and youth resources  
16 program may continue to be eligible for funding if its  
17 percentage of students eligible for the free or reduced-fee  
18 price lunch program drops below eighty percent, so long as it  
19 maintains an average of eighty percent or more for any three-  
20 year period."

21 Section 2. APPROPRIATION.--Three million dollars  
22 (\$3,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the  
23 family and youth resource fund for expenditure in fiscal year  
24 2009 and subsequent fiscal years to award grants to support and  
25 increase the number of public schools with family and youth

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1 resources programs. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance  
2 remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the  
3 general fund.

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
