AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A STUDY OF THE POTENTIAL BENEFITS

OF USING NEW MEXICO'S MILITARY HOSPITAL CORPS MEMBERS AND

MEDICS TO ALLEVIATE NEW MEXICO'S NURSING SHORTAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION.--Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of military affairs for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 to convene a group to study the potential benefits of using New Mexico's military hospital corps members and medics to alleviate the state's nursing shortage and to conduct an indepth comparison of military and civilian curricula, training and job descriptions for nursing services and devise a curriculum for nursing licensure that allows military hospital corps members and medics to earn a licensed practical nurse
