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7	WHEREAS, good mental health is essential to everyone's	
8	overall health and well-being; and	
9	WHEREAS, mental health problems can affect all areas of	
10	a person's life; and	
11	WHEREAS, the United States department of health and	
12	human services reports that mental health problems strike one	
13	in four Americans each year regardless of age, gender, race,	
14	ethnicity, religion or economic status; and	
15	WHEREAS, all Americans are vulnerable to chronic mental	
16	health problems associated with trauma and can benefit	
17	greatly from early identification and treatment; and	
18	WHEREAS, the United States surgeon general reports that	
19	one-third of adults and one-half of young people with mental	
20	health problems go without the help they need; and	
21	WHEREAS, the national institute of mental health reports	
22	that mental disorders are implicated in ninety percent of the	
23	thirty thousand suicides and the six hundred fifty thousand	
24	suicide attempts in the country each year; and	
25	WHEREAS, the surgeon general also estimates that	SJM 31 Page 1
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untreated and mistreated mental illness costs American business, government and taxpayers approximately eighty-three billion dollars (\$83,000,000,000) annually; and

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WHEREAS, the national association of state mental health program directors research institute ranks New Mexico fifty-first in the nation in per capita mental health spending; and

WHEREAS, people with mental illness who are in recovery can lead full, productive lives in the community; and

WHEREAS, a legislative behavioral health caucus would create a venue for legislators to learn about important mental health issues affecting the residents of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, a behavioral health caucus would provide
legislators an opportunity to examine the role mental health
plays in every community and in every sector of government,
including medicaid, criminal justice, education and child
welfare; and

WHEREAS, members of the behavioral health caucus would send a strong message about the priority of mental health and wellness and of finding solutions that bridge unmet needs, improve the quality and outcomes of care and improve our communities; and

WHEREAS, a behavioral health caucus would contribute to the knowledge of legislative committees and address issues that could affect access to mental health services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it support the creation of a New Mexico behavioral health caucus and that members of both houses and all political parties be encouraged to join, or become familiar with the work of, the legislative behavioral health caucus; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the behavioral health caucus be encouraged to work with groups such as the national alliance on mental illness, the mental health association and other behavioral health advocacy groups to educate the legislature and the public on topics of interest regarding behavioral health; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the national alliance on mental illness-New Mexico.

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
