SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 481 requests an appropriation of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the General Fund to the Public Education Department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 to match funds directed to sustaining after-school enrichment programs in Albuquerque's South Valley.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the General Fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of Fiscal Year 2009 shall revert to the General Fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

PED notes:

21st Century Community Learning Centers federal grant funding is provided to grantees for a period of five years. The purpose of 21st Century Community Learning Centers is to provide opportunities for academic enrichment, including tutorial services to help students in high-poverty areas and those who attend low-performing schools meet state and local student

performance standards in core academic subjects such as reading and mathematics. 21st Century Community Learning Centers are also required to provide a broad array of youth development activities and parent literacy for parents of students who attend them. The appropriation of \$150.0 would supplement federal funding and would allow after-school enrichment programs at 21st Century Community Learning Centers in the South Valley of Albuquerque to sustain their current after-school 21st Community Learning Center services. It would also allow new centers to be opened in order to expand these services to additional students

Currently there are twenty-nine 21st Century Community Learning Center Programs in New Mexico. The New Mexico Legislature appropriated \$1,500.0 in 2007 for 21st Century Community Learning Centers across the state. In 2007 schools in the South Valley of Albuquerque received a state appropriation for \$30.0 to be expended in 2008. Schools in the South Valley of Albuquerque have a 2008 federal appropriation in the amount of \$258.0.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

House Bill 481 is related to HB 425 and HB 427 and Executive recommendation of \$3,500,000 for after-school enrichment program in public school support. HB 427 (related bill) appropriates \$75,000 to the PED to supplement federal funds for After School Enrichment Programs at 21st Century Community Learning Centers in the South Valley of Bernalillo County.
