- Because of his absence, there is no longer a "Lebanese Connection" with the legislature, a capacity he shares with former Senator Joseph A. Fidel; and
- Half of the cars in the parking garage bear the name of his automobile dealership, and now that he is not at the roundhouse, many new legislators have been forced to walk;
