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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 22-11-22 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967,
17	Chapter 16, Section 145, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"22-11-22. PAYMENTRECORDS <u>AUDITS</u>
19	A. Contributions shall be deducted from the
20	salaries of members by the local administrative units as the
21	salaries are paid. These contributions shall be forwarded
22	monthly to the director for deposit in the fund.
23	B. Contributions of local administrative units
24	shall be derived from revenue available to the local
25	administrative unit and shall be forwarded monthly to the
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<u>underscored material = new</u> [<del>bracketed material</del>] = delete director for deposit in the fund. The board may assess an interest charge and a penalty charge on any remittance not made by its due date.

C. Each local administrative unit shall record and certify quarterly to the director an itemized account of the contributions paid by each member and the local administrative unit. The director shall keep a record of these itemized accounts.

9 The director or the director's authorized D. 10 representative may audit the financial affairs, books and 11 records, and may interview employees, of any local 12 administrative unit at any time to ensure compliance with the 13 Educational Retirement Act and rules adopted by the board. The 14 local administrative unit shall cooperate with the director or 15 the authorized representative and shall provide access to 16 records, information and employees during regular business 17 hours. If, during the course of the audit, the director or the 18 director's designee finds discrepancies or violations of the 19 Educational Retirement Act or rules adopted by the board, or if 20 the director or the director's designee finds or has reason to 21 believe that a local administrative unit does not have adequate 22 financial controls or procedures in place to allow the local 23 administrative unit to properly account for and pay required 24 contributions to the board:

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(1) the director shall order the local

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1	administrative unit to implement measures to remedy those
2	matters, including payment to the fund of any contributions not
3	properly calculated or paid, together with interest thereon at
4	a rate to be established by the board. The local
5	administrative unit shall promptly comply with that order; and
6	(2) the director shall submit a report
7	describing the discrepancy, violation or failure to maintain
8	adequate financial controls or procedures to the board, the
9	state auditor and the public education department or the higher
10	education department as may be appropriate.
11	E. If the director or the director's designee finds
12	or has reason to suspect criminal activity with respect to
13	contributions, payments or the management of the funds of a
14	local administrative unit, the director shall notify the
15	attorney general, the state auditor and the appropriate law
16	enforcement agency."
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
