Section 1. Section 30-3-9.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2006,
Chapter 27, Section 1) is amended to read:
"30-3-9.2. ASSAULTBATTERYHEALTH CARE PERSONNEL
FIREFIGHTERS
A. As used in this section:
(1) "firefighter" means a person who is
employed as a full-time non-volunteer firefighter by the state
or by a local governmental entity and who has taken the oath
prescribed for firefighters;

private hospital, outpatient facility, diagnostic and treatment
center, rehabilitation center or infirmary. "Health facility"
also includes those facilities that, by federal regulation,
must be licensed by the state to obtain or maintain full or
partial, permanent or temporary federal funding, but "health
facility" does not include a skilled nursing facility, a
nursing facility or other long-term residential care facility;

 $\lceil \frac{(2)}{2} \rceil$ (3) "health care worker" means an employee of a health facility or a licensed emergency medical technician; and

 $[\frac{(3)}{(3)}]$ (4) "in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties" means engaged in the performance of the duties of a health care worker in the case of a health care worker or engaged in the performance of the duties of a firefighter in the case of a firefighter.

- Assault upon a health care worker or firefighter consists of:
- an attempt to commit a battery upon the person of a health care worker or firefighter who is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties; or
- any unlawful act, threat or menacing (2) conduct that causes a health care worker or firefighter who is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties to reasonably believe that the health care worker or firefighter is in danger of receiving an immediate battery.

- $\underline{\text{C.}}$ Whoever commits assault upon a health care worker or firefighter is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- [C.] D. Aggravated assault upon a health care worker or firefighter consists of:
- (1) unlawfully assaulting or striking at a health care worker <u>or firefighter</u> with a weapon while the health care worker <u>or firefighter</u> is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties; or
- (2) willfully and intentionally assaulting a health care worker <u>or firefighter</u> who is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties with intent to commit any felony.
- \underline{E} . Whoever commits aggravated assault upon a health care worker or firefighter is guilty of a third degree felony.
- [Đ.] F. Assault with intent to commit a violent felony upon a health care worker or firefighter consists of assaulting a health care worker or firefighter who is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties with intent to kill the health care worker or firefighter.
- G. Whoever commits assault with intent to commit a violent felony upon a health care worker or firefighter is guilty of a second degree felony.
- [E.] H. Battery upon a health care worker or firefighter is the unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of a health care worker or .176311.1

firefighter who is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's duties, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner.

I. Whoever commits battery upon a health care worker or firefighter is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

[F.] J. Aggravated battery upon a health care worker or firefighter consists of the unlawful touching or application of force to the person of a health care worker or firefighter with intent to injure that health care worker or firefighter while the health care worker or firefighter is in the lawful discharge of [the health care worker's] duties.

K. Whoever commits aggravated battery upon a health care worker or firefighter, inflicting an injury to the health care worker or firefighter that is not likely to cause death or great bodily harm but does cause painful temporary disfigurement or temporary loss or impairment of the functions of any member or organ of the body, is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

L. Whoever commits aggravated battery upon a health care worker or firefighter, inflicting great bodily harm, or does so with a deadly weapon or in any manner whereby great bodily harm or death can be inflicted, is guilty of a third degree felony.
