SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 437 appropriates \$300.0 from the General Fund in FY 2010 to the Economic Development Department to expand the performance excellence training, assessment services, and assistance to New Mexico businesses and organizations in order to encourage economic development and prosperity statewide by strengthening competitiveness and improving effectiveness using the Baldridge criteria for performance excellence.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$300.0 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the General Fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the General Fund.

According to the December 2008 revenue estimate, FY10 recurring revenue will only support a base expenditure level that is \$293 million, or 2.6 percent, less than the FY09 appropriation. All

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appropriations outside of the general appropriation act will be viewed in this declining revenue context.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Quality New Mexico is a private, non-profit 501(c) 3 service organization established in 1993 and home to the New Mexico Quality Awards (NMQA) program recognizing businesses/organizations for commitment to progress and excellence. Since 1994, New Mexico businesses, schools, health care, government and non-profit organizations have participated in the NMQA program and received \$50 thousand from the state in FY04.

Quality New Mexico, home of New Mexico Quality Awards (NMQA), is non-profit 501(c) 3 service organization with the mission to motivate, educate, and congratulate New Mexico businesses and organization for achievement in performance excellence using the Baldrige Criteria. The 501(c)3 non-profit generates tools, education and training, and formal performance assessment of business, education, government, health care, and non-profit organizations.

Quality New Mexico administers the three-tiered New Mexico Quality Awards program of Piñon Recognition (Commitment), Roadrunner Recognition (Progress) and the Zia Award (Performance Excellence), patterned after the prestigious Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, administered by the U.S. Department of Commerce.

Quality New Mexico charges a fee to businesses and organizations for this training and the annual Baldridge criteria competition.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

The Economic Development Department (EDD) notes that Quality New Mexico (QNM) does not report job creation or business expansion to EDD. EDD undertook this training and competed for several years for the QNM awards. QNM does not collect or report job creation or expansion after the competition is completed. Therefore, the program is not known to impact EDD performance measures.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP
