SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 456 amends 29-13-7 to include permissive uses of distributions from the Law Enforcement Protection Fund to include protective vests for police dogs. The purpose of the Law Enforcement Protection Fund Act is to provide for the equitable distribution of money to municipal police, university police, tribal police and county sheriff's departments for use in the maintenance and improvement of efficiencies and effectiveness of law enforcement services. In addition funds may be used to sustain at a reasonable level the payments available to the surviving eligible family members of a peace officer killed in the line of duty.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fund is supported from ten percent of all money received for fees, licenses, penalties and taxes from life, general casualty and title insurance business pursuant to the New Mexico Insurance Code, except for money received from the health insurance premium surtax. A distribution is made from the fund for approved purposes according to a statutory allocation. This bill changes the permitted uses but not the distribution formula so no additional funds would be required.
